



MOROCCO · MAGICAL TERRITORY


Morocco is a country that is made up of multiple and varied beautiful landscapes made up of beaches, mountains, desert and important imperial cities.

DAY 1: MARRAKECH - OUARZAZATE - DADES VALLEY


Pick up at the hotel and departure to the High Atlas Mountains. The route changes the landscape little by little, without even realizing it. From the green fort of the valleys, to the red ocher of the Col de Tizi N "Tichka until reaching Ouarzazate. Free time for lunch. Departure by the route of the Thousand Kasbahs, until reaching Kelaa M'gouna (Valley of the roses), famous town for its rose water distillery. The route of the Kasbahs, by car is spectacular, with hundreds of kasbahs that the Berbers erected to defend themselves against invaders and that are dotted throughout the route, winding through impressive landscapes typical of the Sahara desert, towns, forests and palm groves Arrival in Dades.

DAY 2: DADES VALLEY - TODRA GORGES - MERZOUGA

Breakfast and departure to one of the most beautiful natural places of the trip, the Dades Valley owes its name to the river that meanders nestled between the mountains along the route, backed by ocher, terracotta and red cliffs. Visitors can enjoy beautiful Kasbahs, fortified mansions, mountains crossed by streams and canyons... The Dades Valley has a wild landscape, with snow on one side and a semi-desert on the other. Its wild grandeur and unearthly silence can only be matched by the Grand Canyon. The river forms the valley along a winding path full of fruits, nuts, wheat, birches and almond trees, giving us a setting of spectacular rock formations. Stop en route for lunch. Then departure to the desert. The road is getting harder and harder and the towns through which we are passing more and more authentic until we enter the domains of the desert people, the Amazigh people, better known among us as Berbers. Arrival in Erfoud, the main pre-Saharan town of Tafilalet with an oasis that covers an area of about 5,000 hectares and has more than 300,000 date palms. Visit a fossil extraction center, where we can appreciate the amount of aquatic life that existed in the Quaternary on what is now the Sahara desert. Continuation to Merzouga.







DAY 3: MERZOUGA

Breakfast at the hotel and departure by 4x4 to enjoy an intense day in the desert, visiting the nomadic tribes, we will see oases and enjoying the Dakar rally track. We will also visit the famous town of Khamlia where we will enjoy the music of the Gnawa, descendants of the slaves who came from Africa. Free time to eat. In the afternoon we will go to the point where we take the dromedaries that take us for a walk through the spectacular dunes until we reach our camp where we spend the night.

If time permits, you can enjoy an impressive sunset over the dunes, Dinner and accommodation under millions of stars.

DAY 4: MERZOUGA - MIDELT - IFRANE - FES

Today you have to get up early to enjoy the sunrise in the desert from the great dune. Then return to the camp to take a shower, have breakfast and departure to the Ziz Valley. We will pass through Erfoud, known for its fossils, located in an immense oasis that follows the channels of the rivers that descend from the Atlas, with beautiful views of the desert. Various sequences from the movie The Mummy were filmed in different locations around the city. We continue our route until we reach Midelt, an important town located in the Middle Atlas. Free lunch and we continue our route to the imperial city of Fez, passing through Ifrane, known as 'Moroccan Switzerland'. Arrival in Fez and transfer to the accommodation hotel.
