DAY 1 : CITY OF ORIGIN - CASABLANCA - RABAT

Arrival at Casablanca airport,

Assistance and transfer to the city.

Panoramic visit of the economic capital of the country, we will see the exterior of the

Hassan II Mosque, one of the largest mosques in the world,

Continuation to Rabat, the administrative capital of Morocco,

Due to its cultural and historical value, the city has been declared a World Heritage Site by Unesco.

Transfer to your hotel,

Dinner and accommodation at the hotel,





DAY 2 : RABAT – MEKNES – VOLUBILIS - FES

Breakfast at the hotel,

Departure for the visit of Rabat, we will pass by the exteriors of the Royal Palace and its gardens, the Hassan tower and the Mausoleum of Mohamed V.

Continuation to Meknes, the Ismaili city, whose beauty is only matched by its glorious history, is naturally privileged by the diversity of its geographical advantages. Meknes, an obligatory crossing point between the Atlantic plains and the eastern plateaus, between the Middle-North Atlas and the pre-Rif hills, you will be able to enjoy the splendor of the natural contrast. Imperial City of Morocco, Meknes, whose medina is classified as a World Heritage Site.

Visit of the city, linked to the name of Moulay Ismail, the great sultan of the Alaouite dynasty, where we will observe the walled Medina of the city, the Bab Mansour gate and the Hedim square.

Lunch in the Medina,

Departure to the Roman ruins of Volubilis, of Carthaginian origin (3rd century AD), the city, it was called Oulili, which seems to be a deformation of «oualili» ('oleanders' in Berber).

Continuation to Fez,

Arrival at your hotel,

Dinner and accommodation at the hotel,





DAY 3 : FES

Breakfast at the hotel,

Departure for the visit of Fez, cultural capital and the oldest of the imperial cities of the country.

9th century city that is a great medina, the best preserved in the Arab world, undergoing restoration and the largest living monument in all of Morocco, the largest urban area in the world without car traffic.

The Medina of Fez classified as world heritage by UNESCO has managed to preserve all its authenticity and its original stamp for more than 1200 years, the result of the mixture of various civilizations, Arab, Andalusian, Berber and Hebrew. Strolling through the labyrinthine streets of Fez, transports you to past worlds in which potters, forgers and craftsmen coexist with the foreign visitor, who never ceases to be surprised by observing its people and smelling the multiple aromas and smells that flood the atmosphere of this city.

Approaching the Royal Palace and touring the Jewish quarter, the impressive Medina, with its typical shops and artisan neighborhoods, the exterior of the Mosque, the Al Bouanania Koranic school and the El Quaraouiyne University.

Lunch in a typical restaurant in the medina. We will discover from the outside the rich decoration of the Mosque of the Andalusians and the outside of the tomb of Moulay Idriss, to end with a beautiful panoramic view of Fez and its surroundings from one of the highest points of the city.

Back to the hotel,

Dinner and accommodation at the hotel.





DAY 4 : FES – IFRANE – MIDELT – ERFOUD - MERZOUGA

Breakfast at the hotel,

Departure for Erfoud via Ifrane and Midelt.

Lunch,

We continue to Erfoud, the last city before the desert surrounded by palm groves. Continuation to the desert of Merzouga,

Arrival in Merzouga where we will contemplate its golden sand dunes and we will live a magical experience when we appreciate a magnificent sunset and enjoy a dinner in camp among the dunes,

Dinner and accommodation under millions of stars





DAY 5 : MERZOUGA - OUARZAZATE

Breakfast at the camp,

We will be able to contemplate an unforgettable sunrise in the desert.

Departure to Tinghir to visit the Todra Gorges, two 300-meter-high cliffs separated, in their narrowest part, by a corridor of only twenty meters.

Free lunch,

Continuation to Boulmane, along the Dades Valley (valley of the Roses), to reach the city of Ouarzazate at dusk.

Dinner and accommodation at the hotel,

DAY 6 : OUARZAZATE – AIT BEN HADDOU - MARRAKECH

Breakfast at the hotel,

Departure to visit Ouarzazate and visit the Kasbah of Taourirt, once the residence of the pasha of Marrakech, built in adobe with crenellated towers. Visits are the old Glaoui apartments, the dining room and the bedroom of his favorite, which retain their painted stucco decoration and cedar wood ceilings.

Continuation to the Kasbah of Aït Ben Haddou, one of the oldest and best preserved in Morocco. Free lunch,

Continuation to Marrakech crossing the high Atlas through the Tizi n'Tichka pass.

Arrival at your hotel in Marrakech,

Dinner and accommodation at the hotel,







DAY 7 : MARRAKECH

Breakfast at the hotel and departure with our guide to the prestigious Koutoubia Mosque, one of the most beautiful mosques in the Muslim West. Of Almohad origin and Hispano-Moorish style, it is made up of a wide central nave and sixteen parallel naves. Inside, the capitals and the beautiful coffered ceiling stand out.

Later, we will head to the Saadies tombs, they date from the end of the 16th century and are located in a closed garden that is accessed through a small corridor. After the threshold, we find mausoleums of great beauty, decorated with mosaics, and different tombs that keep sultans, warriors and servants of the Saadian dynasty buried.

After visiting this place we will go to the Bahia Palace, from the 19th century with large gardens and beautifully decorated patios. It was the residence of the French resident General Lyautey.

Continuation to Jemaa El Fnaa Square, which is the central square of Marrakech and the most important place in the medina. In it the public life of Marrakech takes place both day and night. The best thing about Jemaa el Fna Square is the transformation it undergoes throughout the day. Time to enjoy lunch in a good restaurant inside the Medina.

After lunch, entering through the Jemaa el Fna Square and touring the Souk through its dozens of labyrinthine streets. Here you can buy all kinds of clothes, spices, food, crafts and typical products. In the souk you will find artisans grouped by guilds: dyers, basket makers and ironmongers are some of the trades that meet in the Marrakech souk.

Dinner and accommodation at the hotel,

DAY 8 : MARRAKECH – CITY OF ORIGIN

Breakfast at the hotel, transfer to the airport according to flight departure time.
